Summer run Steelhead, Sockeye, Coho and Pinks are in the river now. Fly fishermen at Ferry Island in Terrace are

still hooking a few fresh Sockeye. Most of the run has gone through. **Tip:** you can also catch Sockeye bottom bouncing a small spin and glow. **Reg:** all wild Steelhead everywhere in British Columbia are catch and release. I suggest the fishing rod be a [GLoomis](#) STR 1265c/10'6" MED-HEAVY Moderate Action (GL 2 8-17lb – 3/8 to 1 oz.). Reel [Shimano](#) Calcutta (400B) filled with 20lb test [Maxima](#) mono. [Gibbs](#) makes some great floats. Be sure to use a [Gamakatsu](#) hook. **Tip:** most fishermen fishing for Sockeye are using fly rods but you can hook just as many by bottom bouncing a small spin and glow.

Kalum River:

Both the lower and upper sections are in good shape. Chinook closed August 7th for the whole river. Steelhead should start coming in soon and even the odd Coho. This river seems to have all three runs of Steelhead, spring, summer and fall. The fall run, from my experience, is the largest. So if you are coming to the Kalum to fish for Steelhead I would suggest the fall, starting mid September to end of October. The fishing guides can guide now until November 1st. If you are interested to book a trip [contact me](#) anytime. Guides and rod-days are very limited on this river so book soon. **Warning:** Jet boater be very cautious as a few new channels on the lower end have formed and logs are nearly across the river.

How to: This is a good river to float fish a Pink Worm or Goey Bob. I suggest the fishing rod be a [GLoomis](#) STR 1265c/10'6" MED-HEAVY Moderate Action (GL 2 8-17lb – 3/8 to 1 oz.). Reel [Shimano](#) Calcutta (400B) filled with 20lb test [Maxima](#) mono. [Gibbs](#) makes some great floats. Be sure to use a [Gamakatsu](#) hook. **Fly fishing suggestion:** [Kamloops Dragon fly rod](#), [10' Kamloops fly reel](#), AFTMA #8line. Backing [Dragon Fly](#) "Bright Orange" 30lb, 150 yard spool. Fly line [SA Sharkskin](#) Steelhead WF-8-F.

Lakelse River:

Fri Aug 31/12 5:11am

I have a report a few Coho were caught off the Lakelse River Bridge and at the mouth. **Tip:** If they other rivers are dirty this is the place to come to. As long as the Lake remains clean the river will be OK. Apparently lots of Sockeye and Pinks are in the river now but most are a long way upstream.

Sun Aug 5/12 7:51am

Most of the Chinook have gone by but the Coho will be coming soon. Trout fishing is always good around the bridge. Anglers up river at waiting anxiously for the Coho to arrive. Sockeye and Pink are showing up also...but they are closed to angling.

Sat July 28/12 2:56pm

People are catching Chinook off the Lakelse River Bridge. My best friend Lester Bryant says the best fishing for Chinook is when the cotton wood fly...and guess what the cotton is flying. Joking, he used to say the bridge should be restricted to children under 6 and adults over 65. Can be a good place to camp.


Fri Aug 3/12 5:11am

Backing [Dragon Fly](#) "Bright Orange" 30lb, 150 yard spool. Fly line **SA Sharkskin** Steelhead WF-8-F. **Where:** Sockeye fishermen are working the bars across from the Copper River. Fly fishing is the choice of many anglers on this river. Wading with quality [Simms](#) waders and accessories is the way to go. A friend of mine is very happy with his new [Islander](#) fly reel. [Trophy XL](#) fly rod, [Cortland Line](#) and [Maxima Tippet](#). **Tip:** Fly fishermen please wade safely by using a wading staff. [Trophy XL](#) makes a nice one in 7 sections. Easily folds up and stores in a pouch on the waist.





Tip: Babine Lake Sockeye Set - Up Fishing Babine Lake? Use a flasher of your choice (green and red bordered flashers are the most popular), a red hook (2/0 or 3/0 in size) and some red beads! The hook should be about 14 inches from the flasher! Fish are about 30'-40' down. Use downriggers, deep sixes to get down to where the fish are! Mon Aug 13/12 5:14am

Sockeye fishing has been amazing this past week on Babine River and Babine Lake. A lot of people are limiting out in no time. The water level in the river is better than last year at the same time - there are quite some places to fish from. A lot of big fish have been caught.... Fly fishing only on Babine River. Use heavy sink tips and weighted flies... Please be aware of grizzlies and respect their space. Please obey Park rules as posted at the weir.

Thu Aug 2/12 9:20am

Sockeye fishing is open as of August 1 on the lake and in the river. If you are fishing the lake use a flasher, red hook and some beads. Using a down rigger or a deep 6 will get you to where the fish are (30-40 feet). If you are fishing the river, remember that it is fly fishing only. Just like in the Skeena, use a weighted fly with a heavy sink tip.....

Noel Gyger - WEEKLY FISHING REPORT dated August 3 – August 10, 2008 (Number 83)

Dear Fishing Friends:

SUMMARY: The weather was good during the week. The rain came on the weekend. The extreme warm daytime temperatures mid-week (+28 degrees Celsius) did not affect water conditions very much because most of the snow-melt is down from the mountains. All the rivers are in fair shape. Fishing for the BIG Chinook (King) Salmon in a zone near Terrace on the mainstem Skeena and Kalum Rivers is over for another year. It closed midnight August 6th. In my opinion, this was a “banner” year. Now everyone’s focus will turn to the other Salmon and summer-run Steelhead in the lower and upper sections of the Skeena River. At the present time there are good numbers of Sockeye, Pinks, Coho and summer-run Steelhead migrating upriver. Both spin and fly techniques are working well. The Kitimat River Chinook fishing is over as of July 31. Now is the time for Chum and Pink...and the Coho are starting to come in. Coho are being caught in the bay at the mouth of the Kitimat River. This action packed fishery should last until the end of the month or until the fish enter the river. Be sure to check out the Ron Wakita detailed report and photos below. Robin Rowland - Visual Journalism and Editorial

Robin Rowland, the editor and publisher of **Northwest Coast Energy News**, first encountered the northern British Columbia wilderness as a toddler on the shores of Ootsa Lake. Robin is co-author with James Dubro of *King of the Bootleggers*, about organized crime during the Prohibition era and a follow-up. *Undercover Cases of the RCMP's Most Secret Operative*. In 1995, Rowland co-wrote, with Dave Kinnaman, of Washington State, the first book on how to do research on the Internet. In 2000. Robin wrote *The Creative Guide to Research*. His latest book, published in 2008 is *A River Kwai Story: The Sonkrai Tribunal*.

He founded Northwest Coast Energy News in 2011 as an independent, neutral news website covering all aspects of the environmental and energy issues facing northwest British Columbia from the perspective of the northwest.

Robin also continues to freelance for major media, including CBC News and the Canadian Press picture service. As a freelance photographer he is available for editorial, wilderness and commercial assignments throughout the northwest region. That order prohibits the resumption of operations on Pipeline 14 in Adams Co., Wisconsin until Enbridge submits a restart plan for PHMSA's approval. The PHMSA also says "In addition to submitting a restart plan, Enbridge must also conduct mechanical and metallurgical testing and failure analysis of the failed pipe, evaluate previous

inline inspection results and submit an integrity verification and remedial work plan. Enbridge is also required to bring in an independent evaluator to conduct an investigation of the company's integrity management plan."

Since bitumen is too thick to move through pipelines, it is diluted with benzene, naphtha, hydrogen sulphide and other proprietary ingredients =97 "diluent" - to make the bitumen fluid enough to be pumped. The result is dilbit, usually about 70 percent bitumen and 30 percent diluent. Although often compared to crude oil, it is categorically different.


